First of all, he had a Catholic nanny up to the age of three, he took him to church regularly. Secondly, although he was born into a large Jewish family of modest means, the atmosphere was almost entirely secular. In his 1927 book *The Future of an Illusion*, he described religion as "a system of wishful illusions" and "the universal obsessional neurosis of humanity."
