A symptom of ovarian teratoma is intense pain in the pelvis or abdomen. This comes from a twisting pressure on the ovary (ovarian torsion) caused by the growing mass. Ovarian teratomas include mature cystic teratomas (dermoid cysts), immature teratomas, and monodermal teratomas (eg, struma ovarii, carcinoid tumors, neural tumors). Most mature cystic teratomas can be diagnosed at ultrasonography (US) but may have a variety of appearances, characterized by echogenic sebaceous material and calcification. Ovarian dermoid cyst and mature cystic ovarian teratoma are terms often used interchangeably to refer to the most common ovarian neoplasm. They differ from mature ovarian teratomas (dermoid cysts) both histologically by the presence of immature tissue, and clinically by their more malignant behavior. Differential diagnosis of OH includes tubo-ovarian mass, chocolate cyst, but the main pathological differential diagnosis is those of vascular proliferation as angiosarcoma, lymphangioma and mono-dermal teratoma composed of a prominent vascular component. Misdiagnosis with teratoma is made due to the outstanding vascular component.

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
